Top Tips—Sharing

Children begin learning to share and take turns at around 2.5 years old but at 3 -5 years, they begin learning about the feeling of frustration and this makes sharing hard. Here is some help for parents to support your child with sharing and turn taking.



- Older school children coming on the playground at pick up time must be supervised by parents. They must not use any play equipment that is left out.
- All children should wear nursery uniform every day including black shoes / boots.
